Holiday Food Drive Coming Up

Things like stuffing, gravy, canned pumpkin, cranberry sauce, etc. If you prefer to give a cash donation, that is accepted also. There will be an envelope in the safe for cash donations. Just submit them to the cashier and let them know what it's for.

For Christmas, we are asking for donations of hams and turkeys. On Saturday, December 22nd, Dean Troutte will be at the club until about 1pm for you to drop off your ham/turkey donations. He will at that time, deliver these donations to the MFRC.
